PRESIDENT'S PEN

President's Pen Year in Review 2024-2025

This year our club has been celebrating our 80th Birthday. Founded in June of 1944 as the Patterson Field Women's Club, this club has been serving the needs of activity_duty members, their families and the greater Wright Patterson Community for over 80 years!

Change is a hallmark of military life and this year this club navigated a historic change. Our membership voted to meet our mission of enriching the lives of military members, and their families by welcoming enlisted spouses into the club. The Wright Patterson Officer Spouses' Club is now the Wright Patterson Spouses' Club and membership is now open to all spouses regardless of their military member's rank.

This club offers opportunities for people to gather, make friends and stave off the loneliness that can often be a reality of a military connected life. We offer social opportunities like book club, mahjong, antiques and a variety of crafting and fine art and photography groups. Many members gather for lunch once a month, attend date nights with their spouses or meet up to enjoy wine tasting or game nights.

Club membership offers opportunities for community service and fellowship through a variety of monthly membership events. This year the club hosted a family Halloween party, made Holiday Wreaths, hosted a Bunco night and visited the local Peace Museum and attended the Jersey Boys Musical at LaComedia to name just a few. Members also volunteered to bake, packaged and help distribute over 10,000 cookies for the airman cookie drive this past December.

The WPSC charitable arm is funded through three different streams: our on-base Thrift-Store, Mahjong Book Sales and our annual auction. This year our thrift store is on track to raise over \$55,000 exceeding last years revenue by over \$20,000. The store operates with 2 part-time managers and a group of 39 dedicated volunteers. They work tirelessly to ensure that the merchandise is processed and displayed and that shoppers have great experience. Clearly their efforts are paying off.

The Wright Patterson Spouses' Club sells Mahjong rule books worldwide. This book was copyrighted in 1963 and is the gold standard rule book for military installations. These books generate almost \$25,000 dollars annually for the charitable arm of this club. \$15,000 of this money funds the scholarships we are awarding tonight. Members who learn to play mahjong at another base or installation slip seamlessly into our weekly mahjong game here and I believe this must happen at more bases than just ours.

Lastly, our club's annual auction this raised over \$4000 in one evening to support our community welfare efforts. A small but mighty committee organized a wonderful evening of trivia and bidding. Auction items were donated from local businesses and friends of the club as well as club members.

The money raised through our thrift store, mahjong and auction also goes to our welfare committee to distribute. They are tasked with evaluating requests and distributing thousands of dollars to our base and local community and national organizations benefiting military children and families. Some of the organizations we have had the privilege of supporting this year include: Fairborn Fish Food Pantry, Air Force Sergeants Association, Agape for Youth Inc, Daybreak Inc, 88th Medical Group Booster, Military Child Education Coalition, Ohio's Hospice of Dayton, 5/6 PO Organization, Operation Homefront, Beavercreek Band Association, Beavercreek After Prom Event, USAF School of Aerospace Medicine resident Graduation, Wright Patterson USO, Wright Patterson Fisher House, Sugar Bear Foundation, Dayton Historical Society and Destination Dayton. Our club also organized the airman cookie drive in December and delivered a taste of home and the holidays to our youngest service members. Members also volunteered at the Boonshoft Museum of Discovery annual Military Child Night.

The charitable arm also supports the annual scholarship that greatly benefits our community of military spouses and their children. Thursday night we honored our scholarship recipients and their families. Military families are truly a remarkable group of people. The resilience and grit that these men and women have is awe inspiring. I hope you enjoy seeing all the photos in this issue of the evening.

The executive committee is still looking for help in the new year on the Board of Governors. Please reach out via email or phone if you have the time to help us grow the club and continue to make each special for our members and our Wright Patterson Community.

Lastly, thank you to the Board of Governors, the Executive Committee and our Activity Leads -your work is so valuable and appreciated. It has been an absolute honor to stand next to you and appreciate all the ways you use your remarkable talents to enhance our community.
